

What Should I Build?

Find your next AI project in under two minutes

You know Claude can do more than answer questions. But when you sit down to build something, you draw a blank. This worksheet fixes that. Answer five questions, then find your match in the idea grid.

Step 1: Answer Five Questions

Q1: What's your role?

Entrepreneur / Manager / Teacher / Student / Creative / Parent / Other: _____

Q2: What eats your time?

Writing / Research / Planning / Communication / Reporting / Organization / Other: _____

Q3: What's your skill level with Claude?

Just starting (Ch 1-3) / Getting comfortable (Ch 4-6) / Ready to build (Ch 7-9) / Power user (Ch 10)

Q4: How much time do you have right now?

15 minutes / 1 hour / An afternoon / A weekend project

Q5: What would feel like a win?

Save time on something tedious / Impress someone with a deliverable / Build something new / Automate a recurring task

Step 2: Find Your Project

Match your skill level (Q3) with your time (Q4) to find the right project. Then adapt it to your role and pain point.

Just Starting (Chapters 1-3)

Time	Project	What you do
15 min	Write an email you've been avoiding	Give Claude the context and ask for a draft. Edit it. Send it. Done.
1 hour	Build a personal FAQ document	Answer the 10 questions you get asked most. Let Claude polish them into a shareable doc.
Afternoon	Create a 30-day plan for something you've been putting off	Brain dump everything to Claude. Get a specific, week-by-week plan you can follow.
Weekend	Write a proposal or pitch for something you believe in	Outline, draft, stress test, and polish. Full Chapter 2 workflow.

Getting Comfortable (Chapters 4-6)

Time	Project	What you do
15 min	Turn a boring report into a visual chart	Paste your data. Ask for a bar chart, pie chart, or dashboard.
1 hour	Research a decision you're facing	Use Deep Research to investigate. Get a cited brief you can act on.
Afternoon	Build a slide deck for your next presentation	Give Claude your content and audience. Get a polished deck with speaker notes.
Weekend	Create an interactive tool for your team	A calculator, decision matrix, or quiz. No code — just describe what you want.

Ready to Build (Chapters 7-9)

Time	Project	What you do
15 min	Set up a scheduled daily briefing	Connect a folder and ask Claude to summarize what's new every morning.
1 hour	Connect your email and build a morning summary	Gmail + files in one briefing. What needs attention, what's coming up.
Afternoon	Build a landing page for your side project	Describe it in plain words. Let Claude build it. Get it live.

Time	Project	What you do
Weekend	Create a full website or interactive tool that runs on its own	The full Chapter 9 experience. Build, ship, test with real people.

Power User (Chapter 10)

Time	Project	What you do
15 min	Add your 3 best prompts to a prompt library	Start your permanent system. Save what works.
1 hour	Build a template for your most common recurring task	Document the process. Make it reusable. Never start from scratch again.
Afternoon	Create an automated workflow for something you do weekly	Scheduled task + connected tools + output you can review and send.
Weekend	Build the system from Chapter 10 — your personal Claude toolkit	Prompt library + rules document + templates + workflows. The whole thing.

Step 3: Make It Yours

Take any project from the grid and twist it to your role:

Entrepreneur: Replace "report" with "investor update." Replace "plan" with "go-to-market strategy."

Teacher: Replace "presentation" with "lesson plan." Replace "tool" with "student quiz."

Manager: Replace "proposal" with "business case." Replace "briefing" with "team standup summary."

Parent: Replace "landing page" with "family calendar tool." Replace "research" with "school comparison."

Student: Replace "deck" with "study guide." Replace "plan" with "semester schedule."

Creative: Replace "report" with "portfolio piece." Replace "tool" with "interactive showcase."
